WHEN: Fri 10th July to Sunday 12th July 2009

COST: £32 (Saturday/Sunday 24 hour event) or £37 (incl. Friday night)

Gilwell24 is a 24-hour event targeted at those aged 14-18, and consists of 24 long hard hours of fun and activities where half the challenge is just keeping going to the bitter end! Gilwell24 starts at 9am on Saturday morning and will end at 9am Sunday morning. Sleep is not factored into the timetable during the event. If you wish you may either come early Saturday morning, or stay and camp Friday night (sleep is allowed Friday night!).

Tents will be available – for collapsing in if it gets too much, and we will provide additional essential food/snacks for the 24 hours. Food is also available from an onsite café at reasonable prices.

This event gets booked up very quickly with over 2500 Explorers expected from all over the UK so its important to get this permission form/money back to me ASAP.

Please return £32 or £37 by 31st May 2009 if you wish to participate. The reason I need it by this date is because I have to book and send money to the organisers.

This policy will be strictly enforced, and Scout Leaders reserve the right to immediately remove anyone who is found with or under the influence of alcohol or drugs. Parents will be informed.

It is unacceptable for Leaders to allow young people under the age of 16 to smoke whilst in their care. Young People over 16 and adults must only smoke at Scout events in a designated smoking area.

Adults in Scouting should under no circumstances purchase cigarettes or alcohol on behalf of a person under age.
